A STUDY ON THE CHARACTERIZATION OF THE MAIN CHARACTERS IN GABOR CSUPO'S BRIDGE TO TERABITHIA (2007) MOVIE

Abstract

This study aims to describe physical appearance, personality, social status, and relationship of main characters. The method is descriptive-qualitative. The researcher employed the method of collecting data, describing, analyzing, and then drawing a conclusion. The unit of data is the intrinsic element of the movie, the characterization of the main characters in Bridge to Terabithia's (2007) movie. The data was collected by the researcher himself. The researcher found that the characters of main characters are; (1) Jesse is a twelve-year-old boy who has straw-colored hair, his arms and legs flew out every which way, lonely, a creative boy, a talented artist, caring, emotional, and cooperative. (2) Meanwhile, Leslie is skinny, 12 years old, has blonde hair, tacky clothing, tomboyish, daring, caring, imaginative, and adventurous. Regarding social status, Leslie is from a rich and educated family and has difficulty socializing with others.

INTRODUCTION

Literature has been used to express someone's feelings in beautiful words. It is said as a medium for expressing ideas. According to Gyasi (1973, as cited in Claudia, 2016: para. 1), literature is a broad sense of writing to express and communicate thoughts, feelings, and attitudes toward life. This daily life miniature is the art of writing that is full of expression and idea that comes from the imagination of the author's mind.

Literary work is indeed a work of an author's imagination. It expresses the images and events of daily activities directly or indirectly. Generally, literary work can be divided into three kinds or genres, such as poetry, drama, and prose. Poetry is a form of literature that uses aesthetic and often rhythmic qualifies language to express the daily life of human beings. Drama is a type of literature that is written to be performed in front of an audience by actors. The prose is written language that appears in its ordinary form without line breaks. There are so many ways to express ideas or thoughts. One of them is movie. Movie is a modern theater art form that is closely related to drama. Like a drama, a movie communicates visually through action and gesture and verbally through dialogue. (Boggs and Dennis, 1985). A movie is categorized as a literary work because it uses the language of "beautiful" as a means of expression of the author's ideas or thoughts. The movie itself encompasses individual motion pictures, the field of movies as an art form, and the motion picture industry. Movies are produced by recording photographic images with cameras, or by creating images using animation techniques or visual effects.

A movie also describes characters, one of the psychological aspects of a fictional story. Characters are extended verbal representations of human beings in movies. According to DiYanni (2001), a character is an imaginary person that lives in a literary work or movie. Gill (1995) stated that a character is someone in a literary work that has some sort of identity which is made up of appearance, conversation, action, and name. Character refers to the people that the author creates to inhabit their stories. A character has an important role in making the movie story more alive. They give the story a purpose, a reason for the audience to care about what happens in the movie. (Pope, 2005:86). Therefore, characters are the life of a story or movie (Bennet and Royle, 2004:60). They are the objects of the audience's curiosity and fascination, affection, dislike, admiration, and condemnation of a fictional story or movie.

Generally, a character in a movie has two categories. They are major and minor characters. A major character is an important figure and plays an important role in a movie story. The major character always appears in most of a story, either as the subject or as the object. They have a big influence to represent the important thing that a movie wants to deliver to the audience. The major character is well-known as a protagonist in the conflict of a story. The protagonist on one hand is a major character who is generally sympathized. On the other hand, the antagonist is the character who against the protagonist struggles. A major character is always emphasized to tell in the story. (Pope, 2005:133-134). The other character is minor characters. Minor characters are not as important as the major characters, but still play a large part in the movie story. Their action help drives the story forward. They may impact the decisions the protagonist or antagonist makes, either helping or interfering with the conflict. Their appearances in the movie will be brief and infrequent (Pope, 2005:135).

Character in the movie has characterization. Characterization is the creation of a fictional character. Characterization is built to give impression values toward character. Characterization in a movie is more complicated and detailed than in other literary works because it is visual storytelling. Characterization is a way how a writer of a story writes, presents, and reveals the characters in the story that they write.

There are two ways of characterization; direct and indirect presentation. Direct presentation is the characterization that the writer exposes the characters directly by giving out all their personality from a narrative point of view or from another character's point of view. Meanwhile, indirect presentation is a characterization that the writer exposes the character indirectly by showing the action and reaction of the characters in the story. The readers analyze what the characters are like by themselves. (DiYanni, 2001). The audiences have to deduce for themselves the characteristics of characters by observing his/her thought, behavior, speech, way of talking, appearance, and way of communicating with other characters and also by discerning the response of other characters.

Characterization is a technique or way of showing figures. There are several ways to show character. For the purpose of this study, the researcher only analyzes the

characterization of the main characters based on these aspects: (1) physical appearance which relates to the age, performance, how the main character looks alike, the gender, the color of the skin, eyes, and hair, and whether the characters are beautiful or handsome. (2) Social status which describes how the main characters of life/status (poor or rich), how is his/her education, and treasure dignity. (3) Personality that describes the personality of the main characters, such as the mental condition, the habits of the main character, and the way the main characters behave. (4) Social relationship that discusses the relationship between the main characters and other characters surrounding him/her. (Jones, 1968:84).

The characterization that will be studied in this paper is Bridge to Terabithia (2007) movie's main characters. This is a fantasy movie. It was released in USA and Canada on February 16, 2007. The director was Gabor Csupo. It was adapted for a movie by David L. Paterson and Jeff Stockwell. The movie is based on the Katherine Paterson novel of the same name. Walt Disney Pictures distributed the movie in the U.S.A. The movie received positive reviews. Critics called it faithful to the children's movie. They said the movie is imaginative. This movie was nominated for seven awards. It won five of them at the Young Artist Awards. (Wikipedia. 2022, para. 1)

The movie tells the story of two 12-year- old neighbors, Jesse Aarons and Leslie Burke. Jesse Aarons is a fifth grader who wants to be an artist. He lives with his financially poor family in Lark Creek. He rides the bus to school with his little sister, May Belle. He avoids the school bully, Janice Avery. In class, his classmates always tease him. Then a new student his age, named Leslie comes to the school. At recess, Jess enters a running event, for which he had been training at home. Leslie also enters it. She manages to beat all the boys, including Jess. (Kiddle Encyclopedia, 2022: para. 1)

Leslie praises Jess' drawing ability after she sees his notebook at school. They soon become best friends. After school, they go into the woods. There, they swing across a creek on a rope. Jess and Leslie find an abandoned tree house and a broken-down truck on the other side of the creek. They invent a new world, *Terabithia*. The fantasy world reflects their lives. It comes to life as they explore the area. For days after school, Jess and Leslie spend their free time in the tree house and learn about one another. (Kiddle Encyclopedia, 2022: para. 2).

At one morning, Ms. Edmunds, Jess' music teacher, invites Jess to visit an art museum in the city. Jess does not ask Leslie to come with them. When he returns home, his father tells him that Leslie drowned in the river that morning. Jess is very sad to hear this. He visits the Burke family home with his parents to pay their respects. Leslie's father, Bill Burke, tells Jess that she loved him. He thanks him for being a very good friend to her, since she could not make friends at her old school. Jess feels very guilty for Leslie's death. Then, Jess decides to reimagine Terabithia and builds a bridge across the river to welcome a new ruler. Jess and May Belle make Terabithia even better, with Jess as king and his sister as a princess. (Kiddle Encyclopedia, 2022: para. 3).

This research focused on the characterization of the main characters in Bridge to Terabithia (2007) movie. The writer chose this movie because it is a fantasy movie. The visuals and performances made this movie imaginative. The power of fantasy in this movie is used as means to overcome some problems in the real life of the main characters.

It is also faithful to the children's movie story. It was so interesting to discuss the characterization of the main characters (Jess and Leslie) reflected by their physical appearance, personality, social status, and social relationship in Bridge to Terabithia (2007) movie.

The objectives of the study are to find the physical appearance, personality, social status, and social relationship of the main character in the "Bridge to Terabithia (2007) movie. Meanwhile, the significance of the study is expected to be able to add scientific treasures in the field of literature, especially in analyzing the intrinsic element like the characterization of main characters. Besides, the study can assist advantageously for the next researcher who would like to conduct research with similar cases as additional reference in literature studies. Finally, this paper provides an advantage for the writer to develop his ability to write a scientific article in the field of literature.

METHOD

This study was conducted using a descriptive-qualitative design. It required the writer to analyze the characterization of the main character in Bridge to Terabithia (2007) movie. It was Gabor Csupo's which was adapted for a movie by Paterson and Stockwell. The movie is based on the Paterson novel.

The writer got the data from two sources such as primary and secondary data. The primary data was from Bridge to Terabithia (2007) movie. The secondary data was from books, scientific articles, and thesis which were related to the objectives of the study. This is library research or documentary because the writer indirectly analyzed the movie script, performances, and actions of the main characters by watching the movie to get suitable data. For the depth of analyzing the story, the writer takes the characterization of Jess and Leslie as the main characters.

In qualitative research, the instrument of the study was the writer himself (Sugiyono, 2008:22) by watching the movie, reading the movie script, and underlining the dialogues or statements in the movie. The unit of analysis in the research was "Bridge to Terabithia (2007) movie directed by Gabor Csupo, especially the characterization of the main characters. The paper research was conducted in the 2022 academic year at the Faculty of Foreign Languages and took place of Mahasaraswati Denpasar University, Bali.

There were some steps to collect the data. They were: (1) watching and understanding the movie, and analyzing every activity; (2) reading the movie script and dialogs of the movie produced; (3) identifying all sentences and dialogues in the movie to get the data; and (4) choosing the data dealing with the problems of study. After collecting the data, the researcher analyzes the data. The steps were: (1) reviewing the collected data; (2) determining the component parts of the characterization of main characters; (3) using theories to analyze the characterization of main characters; (4) drawing the conclusion based on the data analysis.

FINDINGS AND DISCUSSION

Jesse Aarons and Leslie Burke are the main characters in Bridge to Terabithia's (2007) movie. The data was analyzed based on the physical appearance, personality, social status, and social relationships of the main characters.
