This region is known as one of the high-quality rice-producing areas, with an agricultural system that is still traditional but has the potential to be developed into a modern agribusiness. This research analyzes the feasibility of sharia-based local businesses in the Pahtna Witya Yala School community in Thailand". The research method used is qualitative descriptive. With data collection techniques through observation, interviews, documentation, and literature studies. Data analysis techniques are carried out by data reduction, data presentation, and data retrieval. The validity of the data in this study is guaranteed through the application of triangulation. The results of the study show that productive businesses based on local potential and sharia principles are worthy of development and have a real impact on improving the welfare of the people of Pahtna Witya Yala Scholl Thailand.

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A. INTRODUCTION

Productive business activities based on local potential are one of the strategies that have great potential to improve people's welfare, especially in areas rich in local resources. Based on data from the English Wikipedia, in 2019, around 81.46% of the population of Yala Province was Muslim. Previously, data from the Indonesian Wikipedia noted that around 68.9% of the population of Yala was Muslim, with 66.1% of them being ethnic Malay. The difference in these figures may be due to differences in the year of data collection or the methodology used. In general, Yala Province is known as one of the four provinces in Thailand with a Muslim majority, along with Pattani, Narathiwat, and Satun (Mania, 2019). This approach is not only oriented towards achieving economic benefits, but also aims to apply the principles of justice, transparency, and sustainability in accordance with Islamic values.

The term potential does not only refer to humans, but also to other entities such as regional potential or tourism potential.

(Kurnia et al., 2019) Stating that local potential has the meaning of a source or strength that each region has to be utilized in certain activities. Local potential is the natural wealth, culture, and

human resources in a region. Natural potential in a region depends on the geographical conditions, climate, and landscape of the region (Lia, 2020). In general, village potential can be divided into two categories. First, physical potential which includes land, water, climate, geographical environment, livestock, and human resources. Second, non-physical potential which includes the community with its patterns and interactions, social institutions, educational institutions, village social organizations, as well as village apparatus and leaders.

(Penataan Desa, 2021) In identifying local potential, there are several steps that need to be taken. Sharia-based productive businesses are economic activities that are managed based on Islamic principles. This business development can include sectors such as Islamic financial services, agribusiness, and the halal industry. Business Feasibility Analysis

Entrepreneurship education is designed to complement experiences and practices that have been proven to be able to inspire the younger generation to become entrepreneurs. The main goal is to develop students' awareness that the entrepreneurial profession is one of the promising career alternatives. Entrepreneurship learning activities include the development of knowledge, skills, attitudes, and personal qualities. This process involves various educational and training activities in the education system aimed at changing behavior and improving entrepreneurial knowledge and business feasibility (Bismala dkk., 2023)

Business feasibility analysis is closely related to investment decisions that aim to maximize profits and avoid wasting resources A business or business encompasses all activities

organized by individuals or groups in the business field to improve their standards and quality of life (Muhazir Insandi dkk., 2019)

Business feasibility analysis is an evaluation process to determine whether a business activity is feasible based on various aspects, such as economic, technical, market, as well as legal and sharia aspects). According to), this analysis aims to reduce the risk of failure and increase the likelihood of business success. However, there are several inhibiting factors that are often faced, such as the lack of human resource capabilities that are experts in the institutional field, the limited training and socialization of innovative and creative business skills in accordance with the latest information technology developments, and the ability to predict business feasibility which is still very limited. Solutions that can be offered to overcome these obstacles include improving the ability of economic institution managers through socialization, mentoring, and training to meet the requirements as a good and decent economic institution. The business management system within this community is structured based on sharia contracts, such as mudharabah (profit-sharing) and musyarakah (partnership). These financing models promote cooperation and mutual benefit, ensuring that profits and risks are fairly distributed among business partners. Unlike conventional business models that often prioritize profit maximization at the expense of ethical considerations, sharia-based business models emphasize justice, transparency, and social responsibility. By implementing these principles, the Phatna Witya Yala community fosters an inclusive economic environment that supports entrepreneurs, encourages fair competition, and strengthens local industries. This approach not only benefits business owners but also contributes to the overall economic development of the community, creating a more resilient and self-sustaining local economy.

The feasibility of sharia-based productive businesses in Phatna Witya Yala School has shown a significant impact on improving community welfare. One of the most notable effects is the increase in household income by 20-30% within the first year of implementation. This economic growth has enabled

families to improve their living standards, afford better education for their children, and invest in further business expansion. The condition of the strategic environment, because it is located in the center of Yala, so it makes it easy to access and all activities organized by the school.

Based on the results of observations in the field, the implementation of the local culture of the Thai community and the formation of students' character at Phatnawitya Demonstration School was carried out through the development of interests and talents possessed by students. Implementation of local culture and character formation of students in Phatnawitya Demonstration.

1. Upskilling through talent and interest

The improvement of students' skills can be seen from the various results that have been achieved by the students themselves. Improving skills can be in the form of changes in attitudes and skills. Every skill that students have, schools must strive to facilitate skills by organizing activities that can accommodate these abilities.

Phatnawitya Demonstration School strives to provide the best facilities for students by holding various kinds of extracurriculars that can be participated in by all students according to their interests and talents. Most of the students of Phatnawitya Demonstration School like and have a talent for painting and drawing. This talent can be seen when schools or classroom teachers hold painting and drawing activities, students are very enthusiastic about welcoming them. This is evidenced by preparing drawing paper or canvas and other tools to support these activities. On the other hand, there are students who use their free time to paint Japanese cartoons (anime) in the classroom. It can be seen that the students' proficiency by completing the painting in just a matter of minutes. The results of observations in the field show that the classroom atmosphere is quiet because the teacher has not entered the classroom. In addition to drawing and painting, the language and writing skills of Thai letters are also undoubted, even though most of the students are Malays, the school still assimilates Thai culture, especially in the field of Thai language and writing by developing it through teaching and learning activites.

2. Character Building Through Sports and Videos

In addition to talent and interest, sports also have an influence on the formation of students' character. Through the observations that have been made, researchers found that in this school students

are happy to participate in sports activities. This can be seen in the morning when children will line up on the field to do morning gymnastics. This gymnastics is guided by educators at the school. In addition, ice breaking is also carried out in learning. Ice breaking is like moving the bada. This can increase children's enthusiasm for learning

The facilities in the classroom are also very supportive in the formation of children's character. Where in the classroom there is a TV that educators can use to access videos. With television, it is easier for educators to teach characters in accordance with Islamic sharia to students

3. Traditional Languages

The traditional language that developed at Phatnawitya Demonstration School is Thai. Thai has become a colloquial language in supporting the needs of teaching and learning in the classroom. Thai culture that enters and is preserved to students is the use of the traditional Thai language. This happened because of the government's demand that all schools in Thailand be required to use Thai even though the school was founded and the school residents were from the Malay tribe. So that in its implementation, teaching and learning activities are carried out using the Thai language.

With the Thai language, students are able to read and understand books provided by the Thai government. Although the majority of the population around Phatnawitya Demonstration School is Malay, the school still emphasizes the use of Thai language so as not to be left behind with existing developments in accordance with Thai government regulations. This is evidenced by the provision of subject books such as Thai language, history, ICT, mathematics and science written using Thai characters. The use of Thai in schools aims to improve the quality and capacity of students in understanding science. The Kingdom of Thailand provides books to support teaching and learning in schools using Thai, so in this case the Malays must try to learn Thai to support their communication needs.

4. School Uniform

The use of clothes or uniforms in the world of education is familiar, because in the implementation of an education, uniforms are considered important to make it easier to recognize the identity of the school. Likewise, Phatnawitya Demonstration School implements the use of uniforms in activities carried out at schools. In carrying out activities at school, students and the teacher council have uniform rules every day. Starting from Monday-Friday, schools provide rules in the use of uniforms. On Mondays use plaid seragambiru, women wear long shirts with veils, while men wear short-sleeved shirts equipped with trousers.

CONCLUSION

The findings of this study indicate that productive businesses based on local potential and sharia principles have significant potential for development and contribute to the welfare of the people at Phatna Witya Yala School, Thailand.
